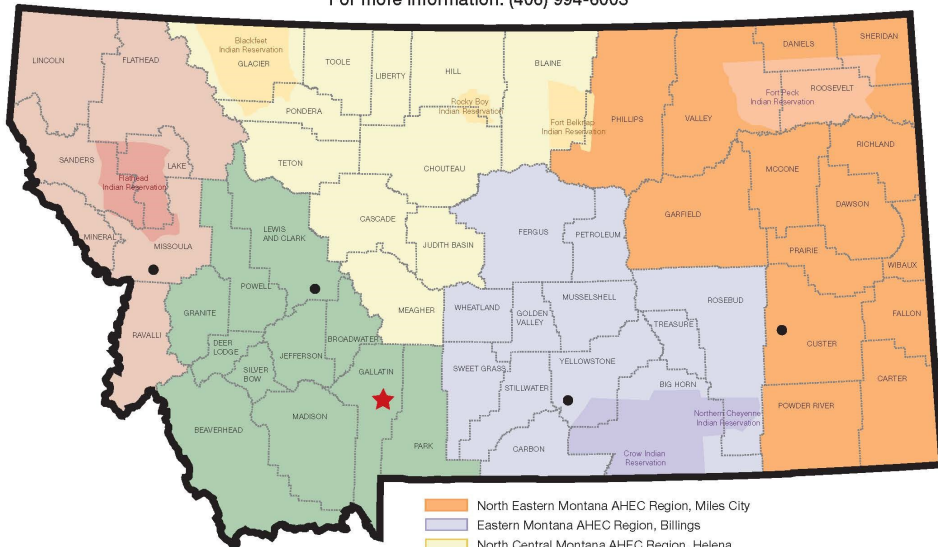

REACH: Research & Explore Awesome Careers in Healthcare is a program for high school students coordinated by Montana AHEC and hosted by Montana hospitals, clinics, and universities. Students get a chance to learn about careers within the healthcare field through on-site exploration of various healthcare occupations. The one-day event is designed to allow students to rotate through a variety of stations, both clinical and non-clinical, with an emphasis on hands-on activities. The program is free to students and teachers.

Between 2012-2016, over 900 Montana high school students attended Montana REACH programs.
