### Nagasaki University Students

In early 2024, WWAMI Missoula hosted four medical students from Nagasaki University as part of their ongoing global health partnership.

- Jan-Mar: Two third-year students participated in research placements at the University of Montana labs and visited Rocky Mountain Laboratories with Dr. Marshall Bloom.
- May: Two fifth-year students completed a four-week clinical shadowing rotation at Providence Lifespan Family Medicine, St. Patrick Hospital (Emergency and Inpatient), and Partnership Health Center.

These experiences enriched cross-cultural learning and strengthened collaborative ties in medical education.


