Montana AHEC is dedicated to enhancing access to quality healthcare, particularly primary and preventive care, across the state. We achieve this by strategically improving the supply and distribution of healthcare professionals through strong community and academic educational partnerships. By operating across five distinct regions, Montana AHEC ensures a localized approach that enables us to better serve the unique healthcare needs of individual Montana communities. To better serve our American Indian communities, a sixth AHEC center is under development.

PROGRAM GOAL

To create a healthcare workforce representative of Montana communities that is prepared to deliver high-quality care in a transforming system and is distributed throughout the state, particularly in rural and underserved areas and populations.

PROGRAM TIMELINE

FOCUS AREAS

Key focus areas include offering pathway programs for high school students, providing comprehensive support and training for healthcare students, delivering continuing education for current professionals, and conducting specialized training in areas such as behavioral health and CNA courses.
